

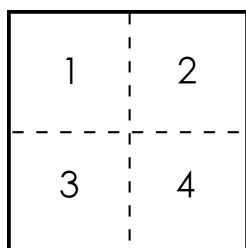


Travel Changing Pad Pattern

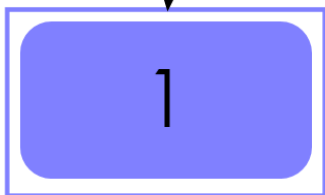
Materials

- ¾ Yard of Fabric
- ½ Yard of Batting
- 7" of 1" wide Elastic



Cut pattern and line up pieces with the dotted edges together in the pattern shown to the left. The bottom of 3 and 4 will be placed on your fold as indicated. Cut a 4" x 14" piece for elastic cover.

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- 1: Cut piece according to the pattern for pad front (Part 1).
- 2: Cut a larger piece of fabric for pad back like shown. Cut batting the same size as (Part 2). Pad may be enlarged.

Assemble Pad:

1. Fold 14" strip long ways, right sides together and sew down edge. Turn out tube. Now, Pin a large safety pin to one end of the 7" elastic and run through tube. Stop when the end of the elastic lines up with the end of the top and tack down. Finish feeding elastic through the tube until it exists the opposite end. Remove safety pin and tack down that end. Your elastic and cover should look like the one on the left.



2. Fold the elastic (scrunchie) in half and pin to a corner of the changing pad (Part 1) as shown in the next picture.



3. Tack down the scrunchie where it is pinned. On the right side of the fabric.

4. Lay batting out flat that has been cut the same size as (part 1), then lay (part 1) fabric face up. Next, lay the (part 2) changing pad piece face down.

5. Pin all layers together around the edge.

6. Sew along edge of (part 2) start on one side. Sew all the way around with a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam and leave a 3" opening in the side.

7. Trim away excess fabric and batting from (part 1) fabric.

8. Turn pad inside out by pulling it through the opening, press out all corners and sides. Whip stitch the opening closed or sew $\frac{3}{16}$ " from the edge all of the way around. The pad.

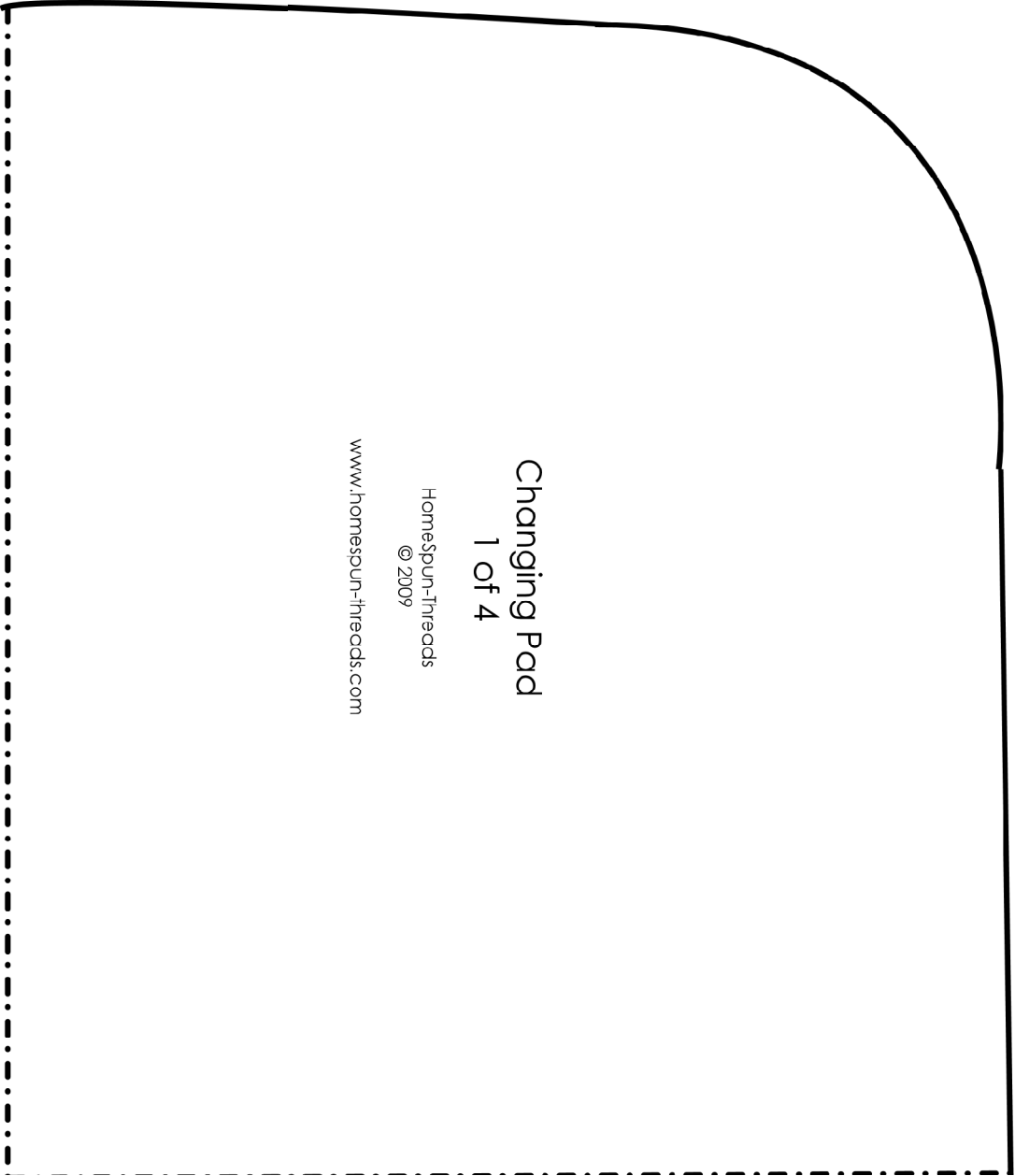
You are done!

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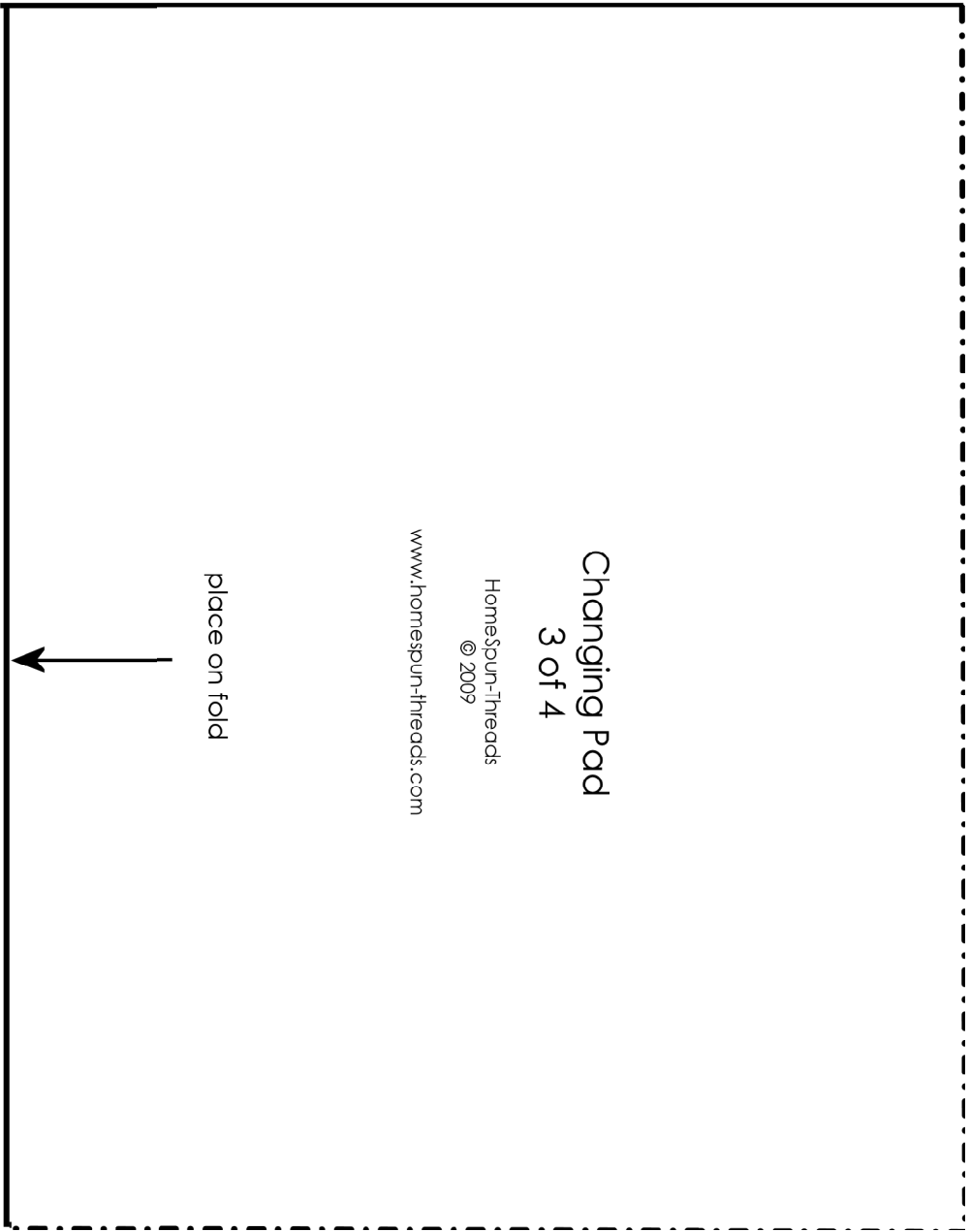
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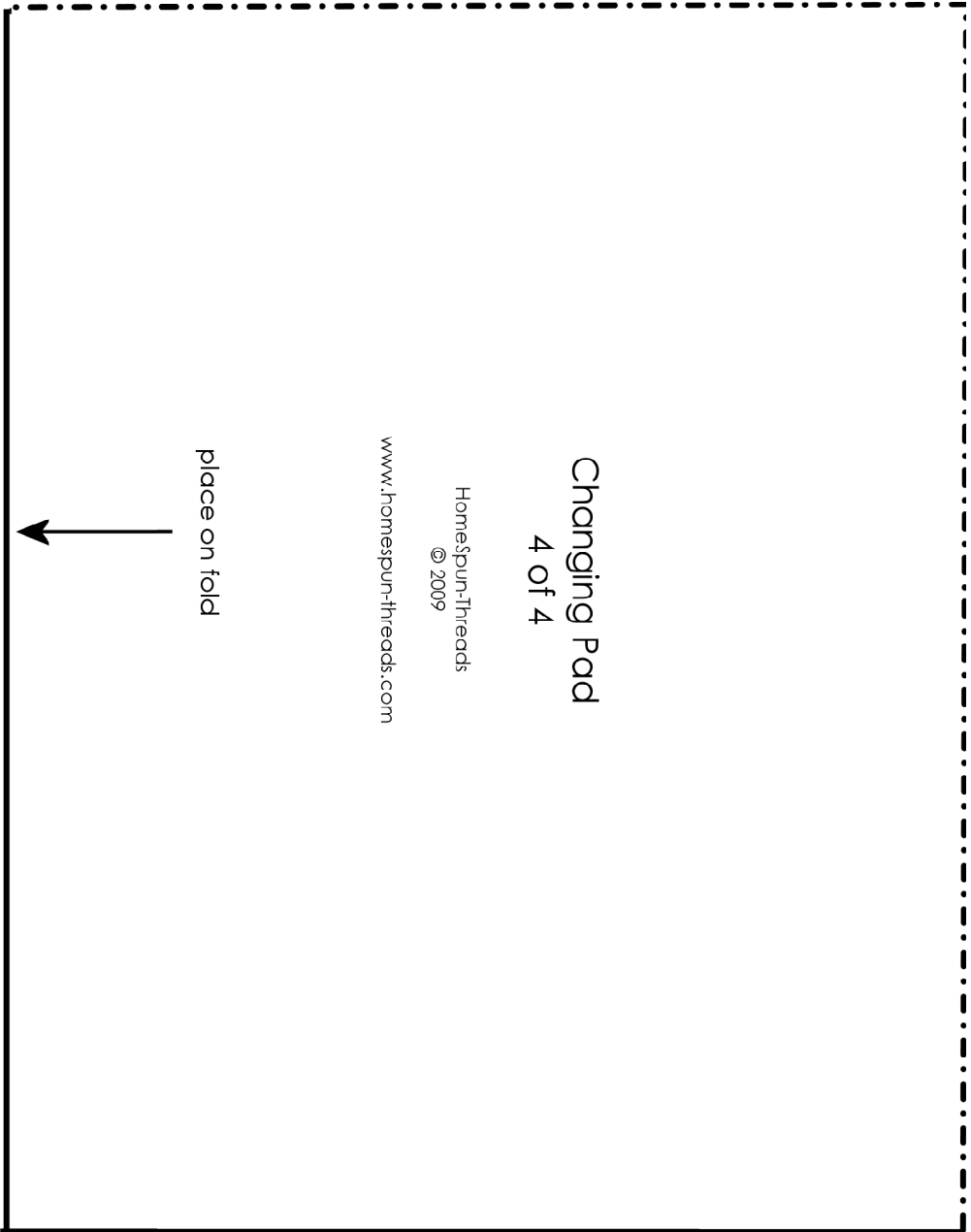
